

Changes to the Opticians Examination Process

Both the written and practical portions of the opticians examination are a computer based test (CBT). The examinations are administered by Prometric, a vendor of the American Board of Opticianry/National Contact Lens Examiners (ABO/NCLE). **Please note: All applicants must first apply to and be approved by the Board before they are able to take all examination(s). This includes the <u>written and practical portions of both the ABO/NCLE exams. This is a change</u>.**

Applying for Licensure- Apply for licensure (by exam) by submitting an <u>Opticians</u> Examination & License Application or <u>Contact Lens Endorsement Application</u> by the deadline. Application deadlines are listed on the Board's <u>website</u>.

Approval and Scheduling to Test- The department will mail a letter after the Board approves you to sit for the examination(s). ABO/NCLE will then contact you directly via email.

NEW CBT Written Examination Process – You must apply to the Board prior to sitting for the ABO/NCLE written exam. **This is a change**. You will receive a letter from the department informing you of your approval to take the written exam. An email from ABO/NCLE will also be sent within two weeks of the application deadline. The email from ABO/NCLE will detail the next steps for registering to take your exam(s).

NEW CBT Practical Examination Process – You must apply to the Board prior to sitting for the ABO/NCLE practical exam. The practical exam is administered by Prometric, a vendor of the ABO/NCLE. The practical exam will no longer be administered here at the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR).

You will receive a letter from the department informing you of your approval to take the practical exam. An email from ABO/NCLE will also be sent within two weeks of the application deadline. The email from ABO/NCLE will detail the next steps for registering to take your exam(s).
